The VCR11 remote control enables you to operate a video conferencing system. The operations include placing calls, adjusting the volume, controlling the camera, navigating screens, and so on.

Hardware of VCR11 Remote Control

The following table shows the parts of the remote control and includes descriptions for each part.



NO.	Item	Description	
1	Power Key	Power the System On and Off.Put the system to sleep or wakes the system.	
2	Video Recording Key	Starts or stops recording video and audio.	
3	Layout Key	Adjust layout during a video call.	
4	Custom Key	The system administrator assigns a predefined function to this key. It is a Presentation key by default.	
5	Vol+	Increases the system volume.

Configuring the Key Tone

You can enable the key tone feature to produce a sound when you press any key on the remote control or tap the onscreen dial pad on the CP960 conference phone.

• Speaker View (): For VC800 system: during multi-way video calls, the active speaker is given prominence in the largest pane. Other participants are displayed in a strip beside the active speaker. Speaker view is not applicable to VC500 endpoint.















The CPE90 has a rubber pads on its base to prevent it from sliding. You can place the CPE90 on a stable surface and keep it away from obstacles so that it can effectively pick up sounds.

Layouts of Multiple Display Screens

If two monitors already connect to the VC880/VC800 codec, a third monitor can be connected to the HDMI OUT port on the VCC22 video conferencing camera to diaplay shared content.

If VC800 video conferencing system only connects a monitor or no content is being shared to others, the display screen connected to the VCC22 video conferencing camera shows a static image only.




Note: If VC880/VC800 codec only connects a monitor or no content is being shared to others, the display screen connected to the VCC22 video conferencing camera only shows a static image.

Resetting Camera

Generally, some common issues may occur while using the camera. Your system administrator may ask you to reset your camera.

Procedure

On your VCC22 video conferencing camera, using tiny objects (for example, the paper clip) to press and hold the reset button for 15 seconds until the monitor prompts "Resetting to factory".



The VC800 video conferencing system, CP960 conference phone and VCC22 video conferencing camera are reset synchronously.

Note: Do not power off the system when resetting the factory settings
